Winslade Farm
Wind turbine planning application

Subsequent to the Secretary of State calling this planning application in, the Planning Inspectorate has now set 6th September 2016 as the date for the public inquiry which will be held at Follaton House.

A landscape consultant working with the legal team preparing the case to oppose the turbine has produced a detailed survey and analysis of the area that would be impacted by the turbine. This indicates that around 70 to 80% of properties in Chillington will have some view from within their property or its curtilage. Properties north of the A379 will have a substantial view. Whilst visual impact may not be of concern to you a couple of related factors might be. Firstly, there is no evidence to suggest that sight of a turbine within 1 to 2 km enhances a property's value. Secondly, the type of turbine proposed (E-3120) emits low frequency noise which is called EAM (Excessive Amplitude Modulation). Exposure to EAM is widely accepted as harmful to health and can be experienced at distances of 1 to 2 km.

Large parts of Chillington fall within this range.
